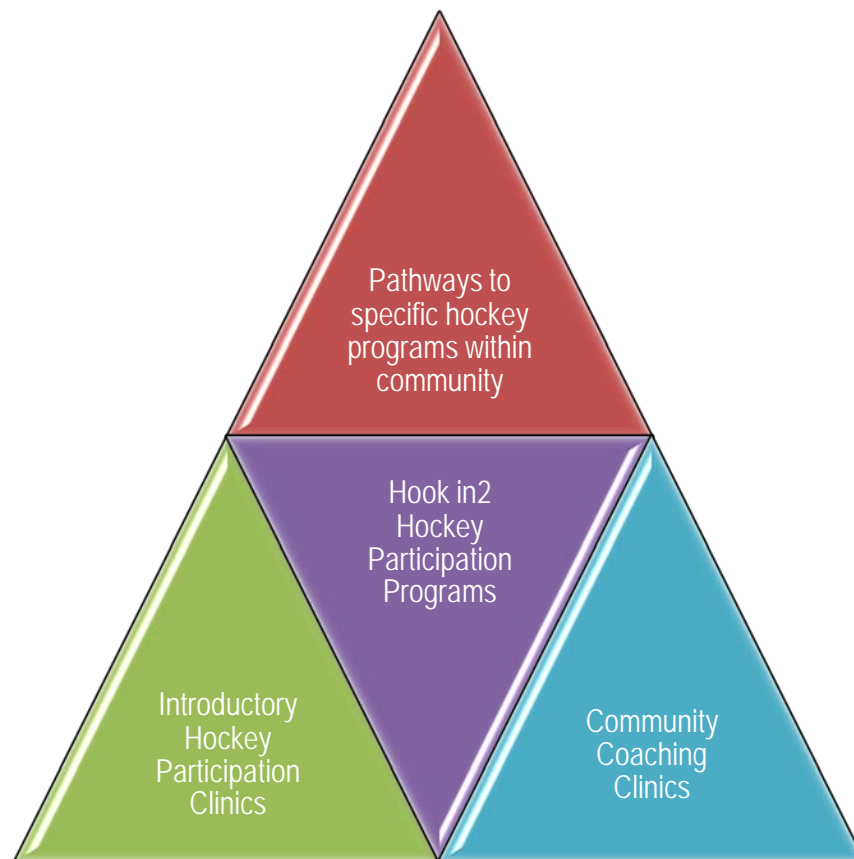

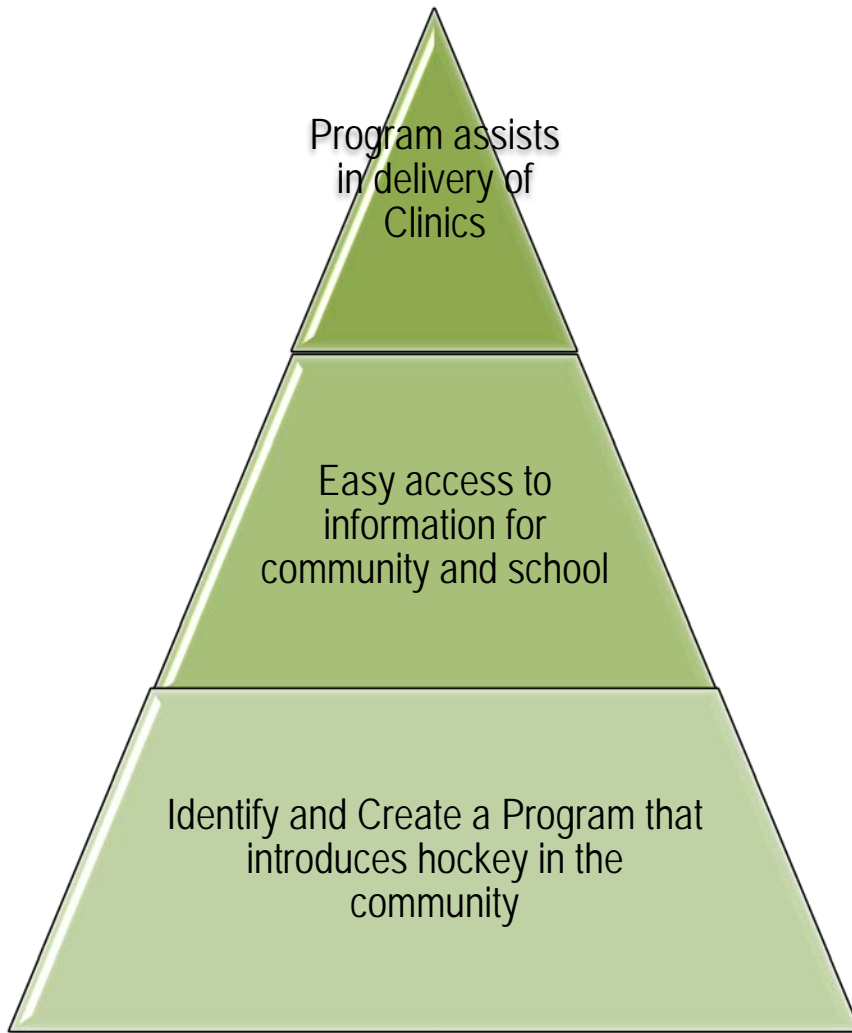

Active Participation and Game Development of Hockey in Remote Community Schools in Queensland

- ✓ *This type of integrated approach could be the basis for funding applications.*
- ✓ *Allows the optimum use of the Hook in2 Hockey Program*
- ✓ *Creates a school and teaching resource for easy delivery of the Program*
- ✓ *Include community engagement and provides an already existing Program to deliver supportive social and health messages to the community through the program.*

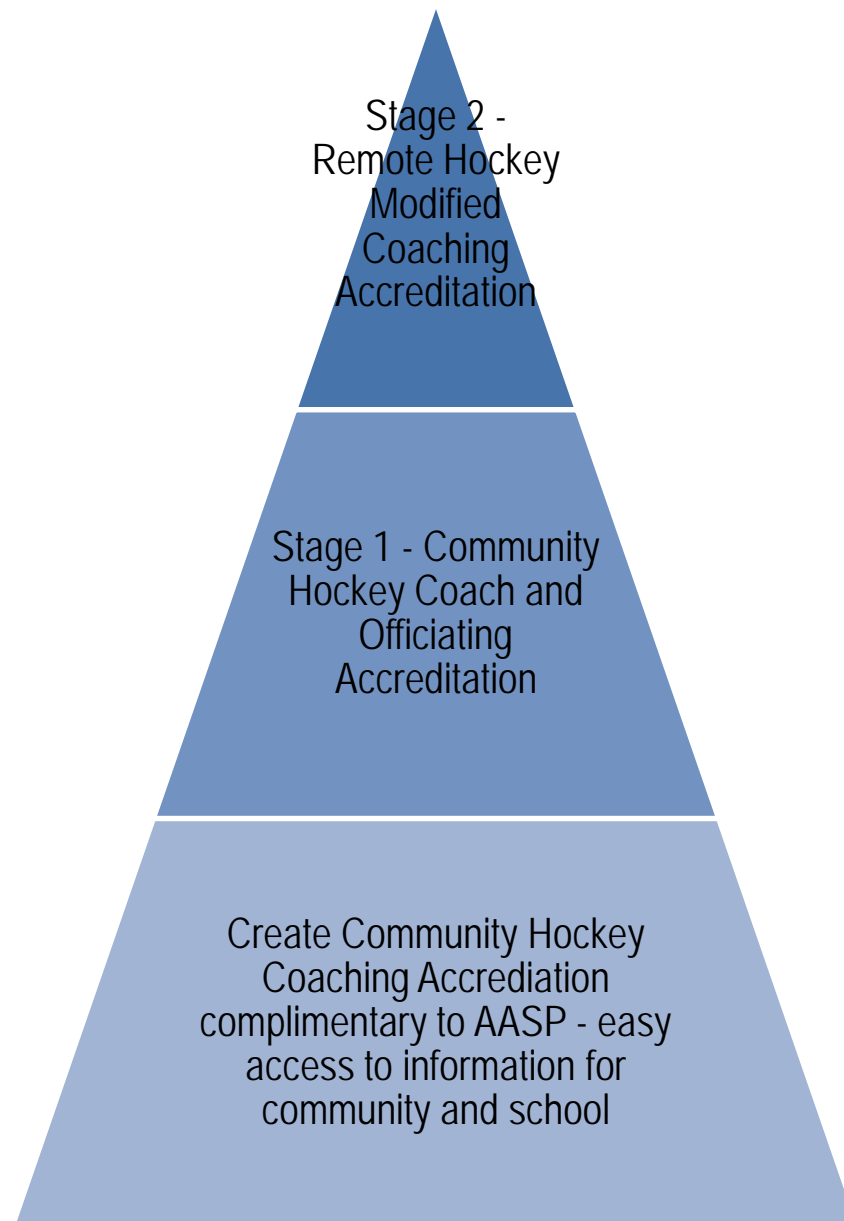
Step 1 – Introductory Hockey Participation Clinics

- ✓ Create a Product that hockey can easily deliver in the Remote Communities – Hook in2 Hockey- Introducing Hockey
- ✓ About 3 hours in duration
- ✓ Promotional Material attached for the participants
- ✓ Target as part of school/teachers resource on the website
- ✓ Introduces Hockey and includes basic elements of the game
- ✓ Data base resource
- ✓ Can be easily delivered – indoor, outdoor on most surfaces
- ✓ Encourages school/community to progress the hockey program into Hook in2 Hockey Longer Program

Many Cultures – One Direction

Step 2 – Community Coaching Development

- ✓ Modify the Hockey Ed Community Coach accreditation and make it complimentary to the AASC Community Coach to save duplication
- ✓ Add the hockey specific details – simple and easy process
- ✓ Make it part of the practical assessment that a hockey program is delivered in the AASC Program
- ✓ Need to identify the assessors and ensure it is connected with community and AASC
- ✓ Data Base resource
- ✓ Pathways for Coaching – next step is the Remote Hockey Program Modified Beginners Accreditation – names of the levels need to be reviewed. State 2 can be connected with vocation education and Tafe and High School Students
- ✓ Delivering the longer Hook in 2 Hockey program as part of the assessment in Stage 2.

Easy Access to Hook in2 Hockey Registration and Participation

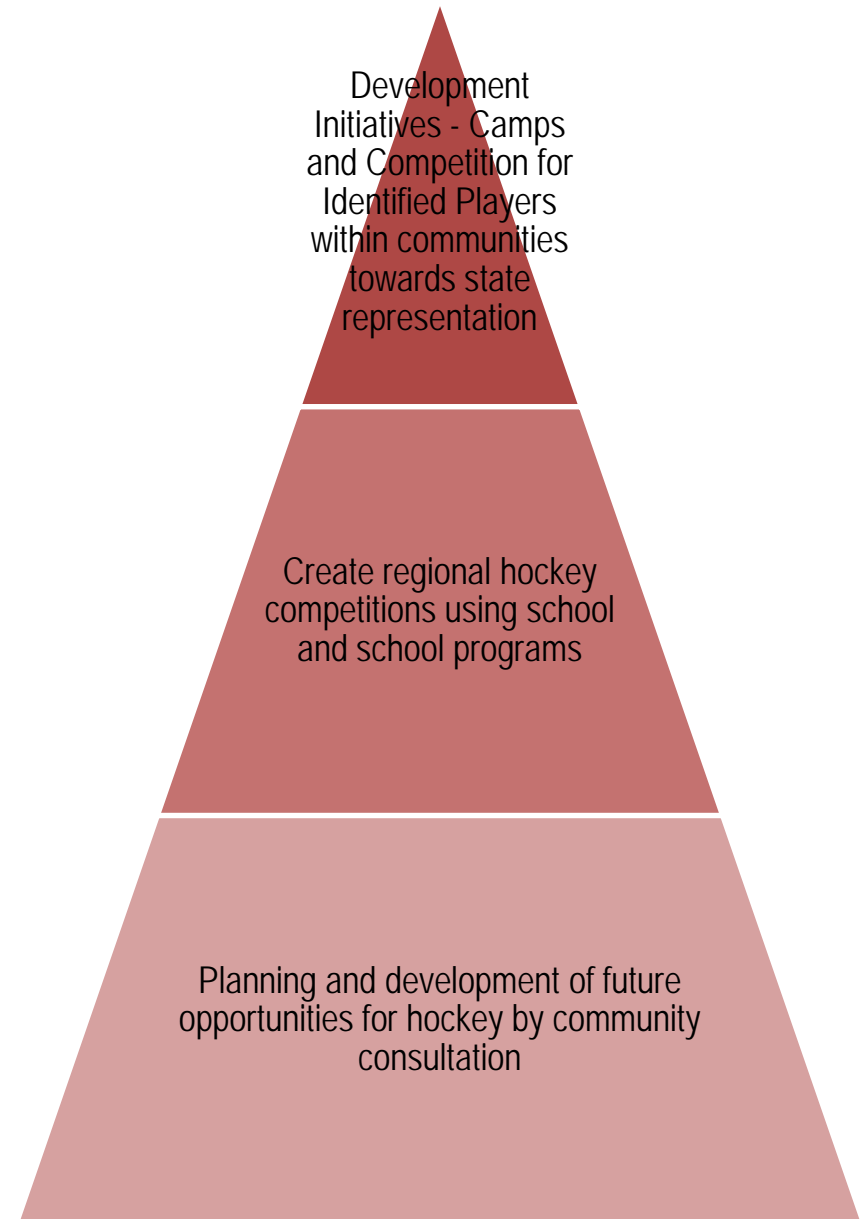
Step 3 – Hook in 2 Hockey Program – National Hockey Participation

- ✓ Use the existing Hook in2 Hockey Product and work with teachers/community to ensure that hockey can easily deliver in the Remote Communities
- ✓ Information on how it can be modified to suit community needs
- ✓ Ensure transport and equipment readily available to these communities
- ✓ Target as part of school/teachers resource on the web site
- ✓ Can be easily delivered – indoor, outdoor on most surfaces
- ✓ Encourages school/community to progress to creating more specific hockey competitions and development initiatives
- ✓ Data Base resource

Many Cultures – One Direction

Part 4 - Pathways to sustainable community hockey programs

- ✓ Community Consultation with parents, teachers, school, community organizations etc to create ongoing regional hockey competitions that take into account – facility availability, climate environment, population
- ✓ Allows pathways for communities that are too small for general fixtures or do not have the facilities etc
- ✓ Identify the best options to showcase the hockey programs in each community and look at tiered regional competition like – within the Gulf and Cape with their own competitions and then move forward to the Cape –v- Gulf Hockey Challenge and further identified players/coaches invited to HQ Development Camps. This is usually connected with the schools in some way
- ✓ Promotion through web site
