BACKGROUND TO THE PROGRAM

In 2011 the Remote and Indigenous Hockey Program joined with Pass Australia to deliver introductory hockey programs to the trainees. This 6 week program produced solid outcomes through both programs and it was agreed in 2011 that planning would include increasing the hockey program through Pass Australia.

In January 2011, as part of the ongoing program planning and community consultation processes, this program was reviewed once again and it was agreed that hockey would become part of the 2011 Pass Program.

It was agreed that a specific program would be developed to satisfy the following:-

- (a) Active participation
- (b) Skill Development
- (c) Competition and pathways
- (d) Community Engagement

It was also agreed that this program would be included in the No School No Play Program delivery.

PROGRAM PLAN

It was agreed that plans would be developed for delivery February – June 2011 and then reviewed in April and any amendments to April – June Program would be discussed and included at that time.

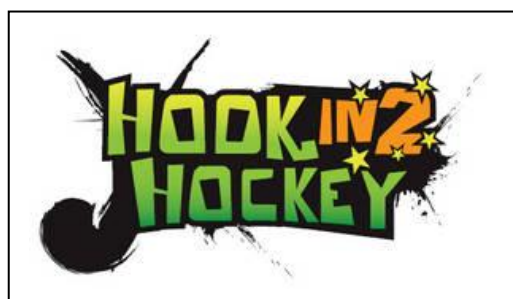

Moving Forward

- All parties agreed to move towards Stage 2 of the Program
- The Pass Australia team will be included in practical hockey program delivery in Stage 2

- Mentor Coach to become actively involved
- 4 new schools to join the program – plans to be included in Term 2
